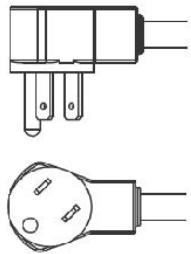


PLUG TYPES

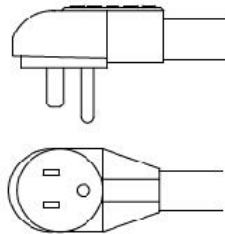
Specifying power products for office spaces has its challenges, especially when navigating the tight spaces and angles often associated with cubicles, pods, height adjustable tables, and collaborative work areas. These awkward angles can make it difficult to get a secure connection, and can oftentimes bend or damage the power product plug or cord. Fortunately, there are different types of plugs to help solve this problem.

Discover some of Dekko's most common cord and plug types below:



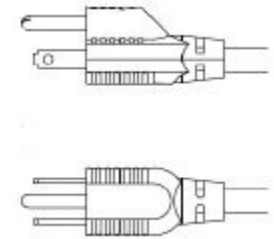
90° PLUG WITH 45° OFFSET

These types of plugs are offset by 45° in comparison to the outlet. This type of angled power cord eliminates any potential strain placed on the internal power cord conductors, saves space when equipment and furniture are positioned in atypical ways, and is perfectly angled to provide access to the remaining outlet.



90° PLUG

A 90° plug sits in one of four directions: up, down, left or right. Like the 45° Offset Plug, the angled design relieves potential stress on the internal cord conductors, takes up less space than a standard Straight Plug, and allows cables and cords to lay flush to the outlet.



STRAIGHT PLUG

Standard Straight Plugs are some of the most common plug types. They provide strong, versatile connections between outlet and power product.
